When your daughter has turned 14 years of age then admitting her in such a school where male teachers are teaching is not correct. If you want to give her more education then choose a school with female teachers. I have heard that there are such schools in Gujarat and Aligarh etc where girls are taught in purdah. It is not a bad thing to seek knowledge but it is not correct to get it in coeducation atmosphere.

(Fatwa: 969/969/M=09/1436) It is not unlawful to adopt a child. Upbringing and taking care of an orphan child carries great virtues. But merely by adopting a child the ruling of real child shall not be applicable on him rather it shall be necessary to observe Shariah purdah from him after he is mature. He shall get no share in the property. Yes, if a child is adopted while he is infant and he is breastfeed during the time of suckling then hurmate-raza'at (fostering relation) shall be established and he shall be a mahram for you and of your daughters and shall be allowable to live at home like a family member i.e. purdah shall not be necessary. However, he shall not be your heir in any case.

(Fatwa: 1353/1085/B=1433) It is lawful to adopt a child. But one shall not become real relative merely by adoption. When he would grow up he would become mahram and it shall be necessary for your aunt to observe purdah from him. Thus, before he is a grownup she can nourish him.
